What is Baroque music?

'Baroque' is a period of history (and music) that lasted for about 150 years, from 1600-1750. That's a long time ago! Music from this time sounded quite busy. Musicians would add musical decorations to melodies, like trills.

One instrument that was often heard in Baroque music was the harpsichord.

Before the piano even existed, harpsichords were the most popular keyboard instrument. The strings inside are plucked, giving it a bright sound.

During the Baroque period, some very talented composers wrote great music, including Antonio Vivaldi who wrote *The Four Seasons*, Johann Sebastian Bach who wrote the *Brandenburg Concertos* and George Frederic Handel who wrote a sung piece called *The Messiah*.


Guitars would often accompany singers with chords. These singers would sometimes perform famous tunes from an opera (a play where the words are sung).

Dance was an important part of upper-class societyin the Baroque era. It was seen as an essential skill - so nobles often employed dance masters to teach them the latest dances.





Louis' labyrinth


Dance master Pierre is late to the palace to teach King Louis a new dance! Can you help him find his way?
